We have come to the end of term successfully and we are grateful to God for bringing us this far. I would like to thank you most sincerely for your support and for choosing Nyandarua National Polytechnic to equip your son/daughter with skills for empowerment. Our commitment to provide quality services as guided by our quality policy remains. I wish to highlight the following issues:

1. RE-OPENING OF THE POLYTECHNIC

The next term begins on 11th January, 2022. New trainees are expected to report on 11th January 2022. Continuing trainees are expected to report on Thursday 13th January and to register for the new term in the registrar's office not later than Friday 21st January, 2021. Any trainee who fails to register by this date will be deemed to have deferred their studies and will be required to make an official application for deferment.

2. FEES PAYMENT

I would like to thank you most of you for meeting your obligations in fees payment. This has contributed greatly to our being able to improve the learning environment for the trainees and trainers. However, some trainees have some fees arrears and this has slowed our operations. I wish to draw your attention to the fact that the government provides education loans through the Higher Education Loans Boards (HELB). Please encourage your sons and daughters to take advantage of this fund to ensure that they do not accumulate fees arrears. All trainees are eligible for this loan. No trainee will be allowed to attend classes without paying the required fees as per the Academic policy section 4.1.3. The fees structure can be accessed through the trainees' portal and from our website. Fees should be deposited in the Polytechnic's bank account at Equity bank account no. **0160296471157**. Bank slips should then be presented to the accounts office for issuance of a receipt.

3. EXAMINATIONS AND ASSESSMENT

The internal examination were administered successfully for all the trainees who were not due to sit for national exams/assessment. They were administered in strict adherence to the standards and procedures provided in the academic policy and our quality standards manual. Trainees are therefore encouraged to work hard to get good results.

The assessment for CBET curriculum started on 15th November 2021 and would continue until end of November. The KNEC exam will start on 22nd November to 17th December 2021. During the period of the exams only candidates are allowed in the examination centre (polytechnic). All the other trainees are expected to be in their homes



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The August 2021 KNEC exams were released earlier in the month. The Polytechnic has continued to register improvement in all the courses. However, I wish to request your support in encouraging students to work harder in order to improve individual performance.

4. POLYTECHNIC LAUNCH

The polytechnic was officially launched on 1st October,2021 in a colorful ceremony graced by the cabinet secretary for education Prof. George O Magoha (CBS) and H.E Francis Kimemia, Governor, Nyandarua county. We would like to thank all the guests, staff and trainees who made this day a success.
